
Affordable Care with Self-Pay Rates

Whether you have health insurance or not, you can still get the care you need at Cascadia Health. If you do not have insurance, or if your insurance does not cover certain services, Cascadia Health offers prices on a sliding scale based on your income and family size. These prices are called Self-Pay rates. See the table below to find out what Self-Pay category applies to you.

The above income rates are based on the Federal Poverty Level, which was updated February 2025. Service fees are updated July 2025. The Self-Pay rates are based on gross household income (income before taxes) and the number of people in your household. For each person in your household add \$5,500 to yearly income, or \$458 to monthly income. Do not include roommates as members of your household.
